SHORT BIOGRAPHY

Philippe Bodin is a French composer whose music, drawing on poetry, literature, Oulipian wordplay, 1960s jazz, and Renaissance canonic techniques, aims to transcend geographic and stylistic boundaries. His works, prize-winning in international competitions from Los Angeles to Moscow, have been performed by ensembles including the Philharmonique and Choir of Radio France, the American Composers Orchestra, St. Luke's Chamber Ensemble, Orkest de Volharding, and the Chamber Orchestra Kremlin. A Guggenheim Fellow and American Academy of Arts and Letters laureate, he holds a D.M.A. from Yale University and has taught composition at Yale, Lawrence, and Illinois Wesleyan universities.
